

The strength of this meeting is that "members share their vulnerability not just preach Al-Anon talk." "At one time more men came into the Al-Anon meeting at the 24 Hour Club thinking it was AA and decided to stay," which says a lot about the quality of the meeting.

HOPE FOR TODAY, AFG began with a conversation between two strangers in the restroom of a church where a Saturday morning meeting was being held in June of 2004.

As Katie M. tells the story, "I believe it was an HP moment for both of us to meet when we did. I was in an Al-Anon meeting that I didn't usually go to. While in the Ladies room, we just started to talk about the need for a Sunday meeting to bridge the gap between the Saturday morning meeting and the next meeting on Monday. I don't even remember her name. I saw her a few times after and as far as I know she has moved from the Naples area. The plans almost unfolded organically. We both loved the book *Hope for Today* and settled on a format. We agreed a Sunday morning would work and the 24 Hour Club had a slot open at 11am." No coincidences!!

From the very beginning people started stepping up to do service whether chairing a meeting or being the treasurer or the GR. One member remembers that at times there would be 70-80 people at the Sunday meeting with "a large male presence." The annual anniversary celebrations were spectacular, drawing people & food from all over! Noteworthy speakers shared from the heart, their experience, strength and hope coming into Al-Anon and working the program.

Katie suggests a moral to the story, "I was used to denying my needs, dismissing them. I had to learn to be open and willing to my needs and obviously other people had the similar needs. I believe this meeting became popular because it offered a safe space where a *gentle* recovery was the focus."

Hope for Today, AFG has resumed its in-person meetings at the 24 Hour Club on Sunday mornings at 11am and continues to grow weekly with new and returning members.

There are very few cities that have club houses designated solely for people in recovery where support & comfort, encouragement & understanding can be found unconditionally. All we have to do is follow the Al-Anon principles of responsibility and honesty in all our affairs. We, in the Naples area, are one of the lucky ones!

24 Hour Club Guidelines - Effective May 7, 2021

You are responsible for your own safety. You are using the 24 Hour Club Facility at your own risk. Please take the necessary precautions to protect yourself.

- 1. If you don't feel well or are running a temperature PLEASE STAY HOME!
- Wearing of masks is optional each meeting shall determine their own policy regarding masks by group conscience. If you are uncomfortable with the mask policy of a specific meeting, find a different meeting.
- 3. Hand sanitizer, hand soap and disinfectant wipes are provided for your protection please use them. Masks are provided for your use at the entry if you want to use them, feel free to do so.
- 4. Please do not exceed the seating provided in each room. Do not bring chairs from one room to another, and please do not allow "standing room only". <u>If all provided chairs are occupied, please use a different room to start a spin-off meeting.</u>
- 5. Coffee service will be available as soon as possible please assign coffee volunteer to clean up after each meeting
- Outdoor meeting spaces will continue to be available in the smoking area, the patio on the south lawn and in other areas of the lawn for those wanting outdoor meetings.

REVIEW

On May 18, the Courage to Change group, which meets on Tuesday at noon, had the pleasure of hosting, via Zoom, another Speaker Meeting. The guest speaker, Gene R., a member of a Philadelphia Al-Anon group, shared his story of growing up in an emotionally absent alcoholic family where he received, at a very early age, the message that he was not good enough. It affected his ability to communicate in all areas of his life until he found his way to Al-Anon.

35 people from the Naples/Bonita Springs areas as well as Philadelphia listened as Gene R. shared his story of growing up lonely and emotionally abused. "My belief in myself was enmeshed in my self loathing; poisoning every aspect of my life - work, relationships, self care." He credited the support of the people in his first 12 Step meeting which triggered an outpouring of the grief he carried all his life. Entering Al-Anon released him of shame, finding relief in surrendering to a Higher Power. Program offered him two choices, "lead a self-centered life and suffer the consequences or lead a God-centered life and suffer the consequences. Consequences can be bad or good!" He found a sponsor and worked the program in search of serenity.

A short question and answer period followed where the listening members were touched by his message of hope and identified with his experience, strength and hope.

Our heartfelt gratitude and appreciation goes out to Gene R. for his graciousness in sharing his story.
