ONE DAY AT A TIME - ONE SEASON AT A TIME. The Foraging Season

I used to gather wild food on my nature walks. In Michigan, it was always a bountiful Fall harvest of elderberries, wild roots, and mushrooms. To survive, our ancestors searched for and gathered food and medicinal resources. But, they would always leave enough for the wildlife.

When I went on my walks, I was connecting to something powerful, nature. She was my first Higher Power. Years later, I joined Alanon. I knew that nature had rules and yet, provided for me a place to process my life. I've keenly learned the cycle of plants – what I could gather and what I needed to let go of, and now, I use the 12 Steps.

The Fall is my favorite foraging season. What do I need to gather? Do I need to increase the contact with my sponsor? Do I need to attend more meetings? Do I need to read Al-Anon material and journal afterward? What can I gather to help me?

Each nature walk had choices. So, what do I leave behind? What people are unhealthy for me now? What thought patterns needed to be re-sown to become something more life-affirming? What previous resources that I used have now been revealed to be poisonous to my recovery?

Nature is continually in a state of change. As a result, each season offers different choices. That is true of my recovery. When I go on my next nature walk to forage, I wonder, "What will I gather and what will I leave behind?"

Answer Solutions To Every Problem



In 2004, Juliette L. remembers wanting to start an early evening meeting. Since there was a Monday 5:30 pm AA meeting, it made sense to her to have an Al-Anon meeting at the same time; a time that fit conveniently between getting out of work but before going home. After approaching a few people about her idea, they met, came up with a name - **Happy Hour, AFG,** created a simple format - chairman's choice, made up a flyer, and registered with the WSO. They were lucky enough to secure a room in the same North Naples, Community Congregational Church where the AA meeting was being held. Eventually, both meetings moved to Bay Presbyterian Church in Bonita Springs.

From the beginning there was a strong commitment of people stepping up to do service-chairing, treasurer, secretary and GR. As time went on Speaker meetings were established once a month drawing a large crowd.

One Al-Anon member remembers, before COVID, how people came early to claim their seat and stayed late for the meeting after the meeting. Attendance rose to 20-25 regular members showing up each week. "Our meeting took a hit during the pandemic. Attendance dropped to a core 5 or 6 members on Zoom, but since we have gone back to in-person meetings our numbers are growing. We follow the CDC guidelines for masking as required by the host church, and/or vaccination cards are shown at the door. We don't want to go back to isolating."

Another member shared that this particular meeting gave her a reason to hope. I was encouraged to join the "meeting after the meeting". As one member noted, "Fellowship is important, we are not alone in this disease. We offer a new way to live. We are *framily*."

María Elena es hija y madre de un alcohólico y, en sus propias palabras, "ha soportado toda una vida de disfunción". Se vio obligada a solicitar asilo aquí en los Estados Unidos debido a los disturbios políticos de los años 70 y 80 en su país natal de Colombia, América del Sur, pero vino con el programa y llevó los principios del programa en todos sus asuntos. Verá, ella había estado asistiendo a las reuniones de Al-Anon durante años.

Después de vivir en Miami durante 30 años, donde había muchas reuniones de Al-Anon en español, María se mudó al área de Naples. Pronto se dio cuenta de que solo había una reunión de habla hispana y que estaba a una distancia considerable de su casa. En ese momento, conoció a otras dos mujeres, Carmen y Marcella, quienes también viajaron una gran distancia. María Elena decidió que necesitaban una reunión de Al-Anon de habla hispana más cerca de casa y les pidió ayuda a sus nuevos amigos.

En 2004, María Elena se acercó a un Club de AA y les pidió que le permitieran establecer un grupo de Al-Anon usando su habitación. Al principio solo asistieron 6 o 7 personas. Recuerda que "... bastantes personas no leían ni escribían, hablaban un dialecto. Un miembro leería en voz alta Courage to Change. Para que la gente pudiera asistir a las reuniones, se proporcionó cuidado de niños ".

Para 2006, Nueva Esperanza, GFA estaba registrada con OSM. En su primera reunión de negocios, María Elena se convirtió en la Representante del Grupo, Marcella, la tesorera y Carmen, la secretaria. El grupo había crecido a 20 miembros.

Lamentablemente, la reunión se cerró en 2008 pero se reabrió en 2014. María Elena y Carmen fueron invitadas al aniversario de 2018. María recuerda, "mi corazón estaba lleno de gratitud al ver a los hombres y mujeres allí. Los animé a mantener abierta la reunión y a llevar el mensaje ".

Maria Elena had moved from Miami, where there were numerous Spanish speaking Al-Anon meetings, to Naples where there was only one. And, that meeting was quite a distance from her home. While attending the meeting she met Carmen and Marcella who also wished for a meeting closer to home.

In 2004, Maria Elena approached an AA Club and asked to be allowed to establish an Al-Anon meeting using their room when they weren't using it. At first six to seven people attended. Maria Elena remembers that "quite a few people did not read or write. They spoke a dialect. One of the members read aloud to them from *Courage to Change*." Childcare service was provided for those who needed it in order to attend a meeting.

By 2006 **Nueva Esperanza**, **GFA** was registered with WSO. At the first business meeting, Maria Elena volunteered to be the Group Representative (GR), Marcella the Treasurer and Carmen the Secretary. The group grew to 20 members. However, by 2008 the meeting was inactive due to low attendance.

In 2014, Nueva Esperanza, GFA re-opened with the support of the AA group. Maria Elena and Carmen were invited to the 4th anniversary in 2018. "My heart was full of gratitude," remembers Maria Elena. "I was emotionally excited to see the men and women. I encouraged them to keep the meeting open. I acknowledged their growth thru recovery and how they carried the message of hope to others."

Today, the group welcomes newcomers and long timers. **Nueva Esperanza, GFA** continues to meet on Tuesday and Wednesday at 6:30pm at 3673 Prospect Ave, Unit B, Naples, Florida.
