In retrospect, I realize now by the time I had my own home, I was addicted to the drama. I never thought twice about expressing my opinion which was often hurtful. I did not see my own unacceptable behavior. I knew nothing about boundaries and always judged people.

When I got into Al-Anon, I read the pages in Hope for Today about THINK. The pages suggest that I THINK before I act; THINK (in moderation); THINK (and pray); THINK (out loud with a sponsor) or THINK (and feel).

It takes a lot of awareness and will power to do this. Sometimes I slip and react, but I recover much more quickly now recognizing when I am crossing boundaries.

I have come to realize that my life is so much easier and kinder when I can stop and THINK.



NEWS ACROSS THE DISTRICT

It's time for group's to start thinking about elections for 2024 for a GR, Alternate GR, Treasurer, Literature, and a Secretary. Depending on the group size and format, the group may choose not to fill all positions. (Al-Anon Service Manual pg 57)

Group Representative (GR) - is elected by the group to represent the group at our monthly District Meeting and at our twice a year Area Assembly meetings, where they share information of importance. The GR brings that information back to the group. There's usually an **Alternate GR** to assist the GR stepping in to help when the GR is unavailable.

Treasurer - is elected by the group to collect and maintain a record of all weekly donations; to distribute quarterly to the District, Area and WSO accordingly as well as pay the group's rent as agreed upon. The treasurer keeps a reserve on hand for unexpected expenses and helps to send the GR to assemblies as well as reads the Quarterly Appeal to the group.

Literature - Chairperson is elected by the group to order and collect money for the sale of Conference Approved Literature; to promote the sale of *THE FORUM* and announce new Al-Anon books.

Secretary - is elected by the group to write and maintain the minutes of group business meetings or group conscious decisions. S/he also picks up the mail, keeps up-to-date phone lists, notifies District Group Records of any changes to the group and sends out announcements.

Members have time to inquire about the up-coming open positions and what is required by talking to current Chairpersons. **Al-Anon cannot work without volunteers.**

ARE YOU A PEOPLE PLEASER?

What's wrong, you might ask, with being kind, helpful or considerate of the wants, needs or feelings of others. This approach to fitting in or making people happy can cross over to neglecting your own needs or wants. Mounting resentments may start filtering in, creating problems in your relationships, and prompting remarks like, I never have enough time for myself or feelings of not being appreciated.

Before committing to anything, there are three questions I need to ask myself:

- 1. Do I want to do it? (or am I feeling pressured?)
- 2. Am I available? (or will I sacrifice my well-being?)
- 3. How will I feel after? (happy or resentful?)

Here's an example: 3 different groups of family and friends want to visit on the same week. In previous years, I would have thought this could be fun but lately I am not physically or emotionally up to entertaining large groups.

This is how I answered the three questions:

- 1. I do want to have my friends and family visit.
- 2. I'm not available physically or mentally.
- 3. I will feel exhausted and resentful.

When I want to say yes but know I should say no, I get conflicted between pleasing others and taking care of myself. If I am not available or will feel resentful because I have ignored my needs in order to please someone else, I have made the wrong decision. At the end of the day, I must remember that I only have to take care of me. Saying no to something ultimately will be better for everyone if saying yes is going to create anger or resentment on my part. Anger and resentment often come out sideways and do harm to everyone with whom it comes in contact. If win-win is the desired goal, I must take care to make decisions that are good for me rather than try to please others at my expense.

People pleasing becomes destructive when I ignore my own needs and continually sacrifice my well-being for the sake of others. Al-Anon helped me find a compromise that allows me to respond to my feelings, including my desire to belong, and still take care of myself.

HELP WANTED

2024 DISTRICT POSITIONS ARE NOW OPEN

fter three years, the current **District 159 PANEL 67** will step down in December. Consider doing service by volunteering for one of the open District 159 positions. Even if you are seasonal, you can still volunteer! The district meetings are in-person and on Zoom. **Al-Anon cannot work** without volunteers.

Each month, a District position will be highlighted in THE BEACON. A description of the open position and the procedures established will appear below. You don't do it alone. There are service sponsors to help the new incoming Chairpersons.

POSITION: Treasurer - The Treasurer Chairperson keeps track of District 159 income and expenses, reconciles the bank account and reports the monthly transactions at the District meeting.

I have chosen to use a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet to track the transactions by month. There is a tab to record the donations and another tab to record the payments.

After reconciling the bank account to the monthly bank statement, I enter the total receipts and total expenses by category as compared to the Budget in the summary tab in the Excel spreadsheet. I save the report to a PDF file, send a copy to the Webmaster and District Representative as well as print 12-15 copies for the monthly District meeting.

The Treasurer prepares a projected Budget at the beginning of each year to present to the voting members. The monthly reports and Annual Budgets are uploaded to the District website for review. Any questions about this position can be directed to treasurer@naplesal-anon.org.

3 OBSTACLES to SUCCESS in AL-ANON

All Al-Anon discussions should be constructive, helpful, loving and understanding. In striving toward these ideals we avoid topics that can lead to dissension and distract us from our goals.

1. **Discussions of Religion**: Al-Anon is not allied with any sect or denomination. It is a spiritual program, based on no particular form of religion. Everyone is welcome, no matter of what affiliation or none. Let us not defeat our purpose by entering into discussions concerning specific religious tenets.

2. **Gossip**: We meet to help ourselves and others to learn and use the Al-Anon philosophy. In such group therapy, gossip can have no part in program. We do not discuss members of others, and particularly the alcoholic; our dedication to anonymity gives people confidence in Al-Anon. Careless repeating of matters heard at meetings can defeat the very purpose for which we are joined together.

3. **Dominance**: Our leaders are chosen not to govern, but to serve. No member of Al-Anon should direct, assume authority or give advice. Our program is based on suggestion, interchange of experience, rotation of leadership. Each person makes progress in his or her own way and pace. Any attempt to manage or direct is likely to have disastrous consequences for group harmony.

THE DR'S CORNER



Al-Anon Tradition 5: Each <u>Al-Anon Family Group</u> has but one purpose: to help families of alcoholics. We do this by practicing the Twelve Steps of AA ourselves, by encouraging and understanding our alcoholic relatives, and by welcoming and giving comfort to families of alcoholics.

As a newcomer to Al-Anon. I was thankful to learn about Tradition 5. It helped me to understand and learn the primary objective and direction of Al-Anon. I grew to understand it as a guideline or instructions on what Al-Anon is and how it works. In a single word, that purpose is to, "help" families of alcoholics. This is done by sharing experience strength and hope and not offering advice, as one size does not fit all. This taught me to not do things for the alcoholic that he or she could do for themselves, in other words avoid enabling. Rather, to encourage and understand the alcoholic. Al-Anon teaches me to learn all I can about the disease of alcoholism. In doing so, I was able to understand more about the disease of alcoholism and where my loved one was coming from. This allowed me to offer understanding and encouragement through detachment with love. Once I comprehended this methodology, I truly could see how I had been enabling and contributing to the disease process. I was then able to see my loved one from a different perspective.

Tradition 5 doesn't tell me to support my loved one through enabling but rather simply understand and encourage. It eloquently transitions over to Step 12 in which the message is carried to others. Providing welcoming and giving comfort to newcomers and existing members exhibits compassion and love. As our declaration begins and ends: Let it begin with me...

WILLING

t is said that the Al-Anon program works to the extent that I am open, honest and willing to learn and internalize the program . But, what exactly does it mean to be willing?

I have come to accept that the more available I am to listen and learn the more available I am to be healed by my Higher Power. I must be willing to be teachable. That implies that I accept that I do not have all the answers. I need to be willing to go to meetings and really listen to everyone because my Higher Power speaks through the members in the group. Even newcomers may have just the message I need to hear.

Willingness also means that if I hear something from my sponsor or program member and think it doesn't apply to me, I need to be receptive. Willingness to embrace someone else's view allows me to learn more about who I am as I continue to recover from the effects of the disease of alcoholism.

Through the willingness to ask my Higher Power to guide me, show me, and teach me, I am no longer a prisoner of fear. I am willing to try new things without the burden of the need to be perfect. I willingly give myself permission to play and have fun without demanding any level of achievement or accomplishment to do so. I know that I am not alone and can ask others for help without indicating that I am less than. Today I am willing to accept my talents as gifts from my Higher Power and proudly use them to do service to others.

Most importantly, today I am willing to change. I can acknowledge my part in all things by accepting responsibility for that which is mine, making amends if required, and committing to changing unwanted behavior. Today I have choices because I am willing to listen and learn from all the many sources Al-Anon provides.

With willingness, I have the power to surrender to the God of my understanding. When I don't feel willing, I can pray to my Higher Power to help me be willing to be willing. My recovery begins and ends with my degree to be willing.
